What is the Mobile Clinic?

Highway to Hope (H2H) Mobile Response Clinic is an outreach program that will offer integrated mental health and primary health care to adults and children ages 2 and older.

The Mobile Clinic will be used in the community to bring mental health & primary healthcare services to patients who do not have easy access to health care.

The clinic provides basic acute and primary care services and mental health services, including patient education, diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic illnesses.

Who can use the Mobile Clinic?

All patients ages 2 and older are welcome, including those using **employer insurance, Medicare, Medicaid and the uninsured.**

What services are available?

We provide treatment for common illnesses and minor injuries, as well as primary care and preventive services

Who will be a part of the mobile clinic care team?

The mobile clinical care team will include an adult Mental Health Professional, Child Mental Health Professional, a Registered Nurse and Nurse Practitioner. Psychiatric Telehealth services will also be available.

Yes. The Mobile Clinic is available for use at local businesses and community organizations within the Pee Dee (Florence, Darlington, Marion); TriCounty (Chesterfield, Dillon, Marlboro) and Waccamaw (Georgetown, Williamsburg, Horry)
